Two of the campers who really had an affect on Jeff were **Viktor** (pictured to the left) and **János** (pictured on the right).

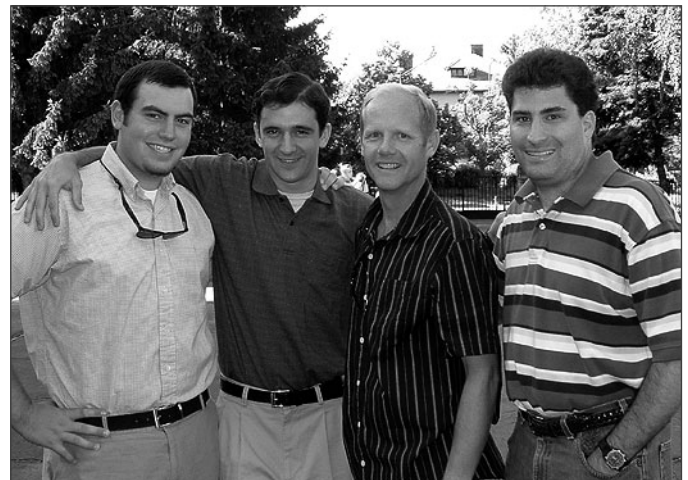
Viktor's worldview did not include God. And yet Jeff did not feel that Viktor was being entirely honest emotionally with the implications of that atheistic worldview.
